Hunger and Thirst

N ature documentaries today, thanks to amazing camera technology, have taught us much. The ones about deserts are

particularly fascinating for their depiction of survival in the harshest conditions. They certainly give us an appreciation for the story of the Exodus – forty years of heat, dust, hunger and thirst. But as we have pointed out before, we need to explore the metaphors. Today we examine metaphors of hunger and thirst.

Hunger for food and thirst for water - and we do not want to alorify these in any way, especially if it compounds our indifference to the poor - is a powerful metaphor that describes our need for God, our vearning for God, our emptiness without God. The physical hunger of the Israelites in the desert was part of God's process of teaching them what it means to be in covenant with him, they as God's

people, he as their God. And God teaches by providing for them.

God sent manna, first and most practically to meet a physical need. Secondly, God wants the Israelites to learn trust. With a touch of humour, we read how some Israelites take too much manna on some days, and it rots in their tents. Other Israelites don't obey God's command to collect double portions before the Sabbath, and they end up hungry on the Sabbath because manna doesn't fall that day.

Lessons from hunger is something that Jesus himself would teach us through his experience of temptation in the desert. His words echo through the ages: "People do not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

God allows us all to go through "desert"

phases of dryness, hunger and thirst. If so, we're in good company, as we too learn not to rely on our own abilities but on the One from whom all good gifts come. But back to the story.

Their daily bread adequately provided, the Israelites set off again through the wilderness. But in any desert finding water is a problem. As they set up camp at Rephidim with nothing to drink, they again direct their anger against Moses, demanding, "Give us water to drink." Poor Moses occupies a precarious place between the people and God. He reprimands the people, "Why quarrel with me? Why do you put the Lord to the test?" The people respond by repeating their oft-repeated question, "Why did you bring us up

out of Egypt to make us and our children and livestock die of thirst?"

But God continues to be patient and instructs Moses: Go out in front of the people. Select some of the elders of Israel. Grab your staff. Go to the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock. These five commands of God come with two promises: I will stand there before you by the rock. Water will come out of it for the people to drink.... And the water began to flow.

For us Christians, learning Lenten lessons means reminding ourselves that our food for the journey is Jesus, the "Living Bread come down from heaven" (John 6:51), and that we quench our thirst at the waters flowing from his side (John 7:37-38).

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:


Glory and praise to you, O Christ. Repent, says the Lord, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. Glory and praise to you, O Christ.

24 HOURS WITH THE LORD: We invite you to come join the Jubilee prayer focus on Friday the 28 March at 18h00. The theme is: You are my hope (Psalm 71: 5). It combines the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of continuous Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We open with the Mass followed by Stations of the Cross and then the Examination of Conscience and we conclude with the 18h00 Mass on Saturday 29th March. There will be confessions on Saturday from 16h00.

JUSTICE, PEACE, AND NON-VIOLENCE is one of the key Commissions of the Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference (SACBC). The Commission's programmes focus on addressing social, political, economic, and systemic injustices, as well as violations of human rights.

The key theme for this Jubilee Year is **"The Care of Creation"**, which is inspired by and anchored in Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical, *Laudato Si'*. Throughout the year, we will explore various topics, including: Ecological spirituality, Ecological economics, Adoption of an ecological lifestyle, Ecological education for all These themes are integrated with both national and global policy frameworks. As a country, South Africa has established the **Climate Change Commission** and enacted the **Climate Change Act (No. 5 of 2024)**. Internationally, we align with commitments such as the **Paris Agreement (2015)**, the **Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)**, and the **Just Transition Framework**.
