ast week Catholic Link drew attention to the two most important dynamics at work in synodality: walking the road together, and listening. The grace of the recent Synod was to do just that. But as one delegate said, listening requires personal conversion from your own narrow perspective when you find yourself in a working group made up of people from Fiji, Indonesia, Vietnam, Ethiopia, Hong Kong, Serbia, the United States, Liberia. Malaysia, New Zealand and Tanzania. Not only that, but the group comprised cardinals, archbishops, bishops, priests, and lay men and women. On this point, one woman delegate from Southeast Asia commented: "Last year I was so worried about speaking to a bishop! Now I'm more relaxed about it, I know he's a human being like me."

The Synod was a powerful expression of the catholicity of the Church. It can only have been the presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit that made possible such a diverse gathering from the four ends of the earth. Delegates spoke of their different approaches to many pastoral issues, but, trusting the Spirit, they joyfully embraced the challenges of their roundtable conversations and, if truth be told, the importance of their coffee break conversations. Joy is an infallible sign of the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Before it is an institution, the Church is a family, a community of disciples. The experience of the Synod gave witness to this as its 370 delegates represented the world's billionplus Catholics. It was a meeting of hearts,

something Pope Francis writes about in his encyclical on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, *Dilexit Nos*. In fact, he quotes St John Henry Newman, "heart speaks to heart." The inspiration of Saint John Paul II also shone through: "*Affective* collegiality precedes *effective* collegiality." In other words, coming together (i.e. collegiality) must begin with mutual affection if it is to be effective. Personal conversion and spiritual renewal, as the Synod document itself says, is essential as the Church builds new structures in service of evangelisation.

The catholicity of the Synod, representative firstly of all the nations of the world, and then of the variety of gifts, roles and ministries in the Church, helps the Church to discern better what God is saying to us at this time in our history. One of the messages that delegates heard from the Spirit was the need for structural reform "that enables the Church to be more participatory and missionary, so that it can walk with every man and woman, radiating the life of Christ."

As we reflect on and try to absorb the importance of the Synod in our little corner of the world, more specifically, the southernmost part of Africa, we wonder how the spirit of openness, trust and confidence that was experienced in Rome can become incarnated in our own parishes and dioceses. Perhaps most importantly we need to trust the Holy Spirit and trust the process. This demands that we believe in one another's genuine contributions to the life and mission of the Church, no matter how different they may seem to us.
