any are no doubt familiar with the expression, 'what has that to do with the price of eggs?' While the

expression has an undertone of exasperation, its purpose is to steer a conversation back on course, allowing ideas to flow into and from each other, giving them some cohesion.

Applied to the Christian doctrine, the same principle is called "the analogy of faith", whereby all aspects of faith are somehow intertwined, connected by an inner complementarity. St Paul uses the principle in Romans 12:4-8 when speaking of the variety of gifts that make up the one Church: "In union with Christ we form one body, and as parts of it we belong to each other." He goes on to say that each gift must be exercised "according to the proportion (Greek, analogian) of faith." In a word, the analogy of faith is associated with the one unchanging faith of the Church. There is an intimate relationship between all aspects of faith, and excluding anything irrelevant - like the price

of eaas.

Let's see how we can apply this principle to our *Link* series on synodality in relation to today's Feast of the Presentation.

Synodality affirms the communal nature of the Church, with every person bringing their gifts to building up the Body of Christ. It highlights the "domestic church" of marriage and the family in which Christ is central. The characters in today's feast model all of this for us. Mary and Joseph fulfil their parental duties and present their newborn child to God. They

take the child home with them where he is given every opportunity to grow in wisdom and maturity. Fellowship at the macro level of the

> Church's life begins with the full flourishing of relationships at the micro level of family life.

Then, Simeon and Anna, each in their own way, model the vital gift of prophecy in our faith. Prophets see events and moments in the light of faith. They read the signs of the times, they discern which way the Spirit is blowing, they appreciate deeper underlying truths in the ordinary. What might have been a routine thing in presenting Jesus in the Temple (I wonder how many other 8-day old babies were brought around the same time?) was, for Simeon and Anna in the case of Jesus. Mary and Joseph, a revelation of God at work in history.

Looked at in terms of the "analogy of faith", the Presentation of the Lord is not a once-off isolated event. It coheres with the entire narrative of salvation: God's work of redemption in his Beloved Son, Jesus.

The Church applies the feast in a special way to the Consecrated Life – the "presentation" to God of those women and men who commit

themselves to God, to the Church, and to the ongoing mission of Christ, by taking the vows of Religious Life: chastity, poverty, and obedience. Within the Consecrated Life, one sector has a special patron saint in Anna, the mystic and contemplative, who "never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer" (Luke 2:37-38). May the contemplative nuns and monks in the Church continue night and day to pray for the Church throughout the world!


